

SVLC New Testament Tour 2010

March 1st – Luke 12: Verses 13-21 should be mandatory reading for everyone in Middle-class America. Wealth, in and of itself, isn't evil, it's really all about priorities. Special note – Do you know the verse that answers the question: What is the root of all evil? We'll read it later this year.

March 2nd – Luke 13: Verse 9 should intimidate us a little bit. How many chances do we get to bear fruit? It may not be what we think.

March 3rd – Luke 14: Has two great stories about the Cost of being a disciple. The great feast, and then the final discourse in verses 25-35. If you want to follow Jesus, it's going to cost you something. It's worth it, it's worth more than anything else. But it's not cheap. If you haven't made such a commitment to true Discipleship before spend some time in prayer following this reading to do that very thing. It can change your life.

March 4th – Luke 15: And just when you worry that you've fallen away from following Jesus, you hear three times that He will always be looking for you to come home. Special note – If you're not the younger brother, are you automatically the older one?

March 5th – Luke 16: Two more stories about wealth. If you ever get frustrated that the church talks about money too much, turn your anger at the Bible. We're just taking our cue from the one who knew what really mattered in our hearts.

March 6th – Luke 17: Verses 11-17 are very convicting, especially for me. Too often I find myself on my way with the 9 instead of back at Jesus' feet with the 1.

March 7th – Luke 18: I love verses 25-43. Here's a man who has never seen Jesus, but has such absolute faith in Him and how He can transform his life. If only Jesus' words to the man at the end were said to me more often.
