March 15th – John 2: Jesus' first miracle. Again, like we see in Luke, Jesus' ministry needs to happen on His own timetable. For all you wine lovers, don't you wish you could have tried this vintage?

March 16th – John 3: One of the most famous verses of all actually comes as part of a great story. With Nicodemus we see the importance of Light and Dark, a theme Jesus uses throughout this Gospel. Underline all the references to it in this chapter alone, and keep your eyes looking for it throughout the book.

March 17th – John 4: The story of the woman at the well should be threatening and enlightening for all of us. Jesus knows it all! And yet, He still offers us the Living Water that only He can provide.

March 18th – John 5: This has two of my favorite statements in John. Verse 6 has about the best question ever. The answer seems obvious, but is it? Are we always looking to get well? And verse 39 drives home the point that we worship a Living God. Reading the Bible daily is great, but we don't worship a book. We worship the one the book points to!

March 19th – John 6: Best part of this chapter? Read verse 30, and then ask yourself, "Didn't Jesus just do that?" Certainly none of us would demand such a sign from God. Would we?

March 20th – John 7: The question for here is, what does Jesus do that no other respected Religious leader does? He points to Himself. Others say follow this path, follow these teachings, Jesus says come to me, follow me. The only Religious leaders that do that are evil (David Koresh, etc.) or they're true and real. Jesus cannot be just a good moral teacher as many want to claim. Verses 40-43 are a good testimony that Jesus was clearly claiming something more.

March 21st – John 8: The only recording we have of Jesus writing something Himself. And He erased it!
