# Pastor's Page

## Clash of the Images

I've been intrigued by a trend in our culture that seems to be a bit more prevalent in our world right now. I don't know if you've seen this, but there's been a bit of resurgence in the mythological gods from Greek and Roman times.

I'll admit, I find some of these stories entertaining and have enjoyed some of these cultural pieces for what they are meant to be. If you haven't read *Percy Jackson and the Olympians*, or seen the movie, I'll admit I found the books and the movie pretty enjoyable. And the remake of *Clash of the Titans* (in 3-D no less) both interests me and makes me remember fondly seeing the original with its now cheesy special effects that captured my imagination in its time.

Now, again, I take all these stories as the fiction they are, and I imagine most people simply leave it at that. But I noticed another trend in this mythological view of gods that may not be noticed at first glance. It is the idea that the gods of these myths saw humans as people to be manipulated. That humans existed for their entertainment, to be their servants, and that their actions and loyalty could either gain reward and favor, or hardship and loss depending on the mood and feeling of the gods at the time.

Boy, am I glad those are just myths. Because this month we are reminded what believing in the one, true God actually means. On Easter we celebrate that there is a God, and instead of seeing us as creatures to amuse Him or serve Him, He went the other direction. He came down to earth, and even though He was God did not use His powers or exploited people, but instead took on the form of a servant to others (see *Philippians 2:5-11*)

Jesus dwelt among us, in similar fashion to the "gods" of myth, but Jesus was so unlike those stories. He cared for the

widow, and the orphan, and the poor. He didn't seek power or prestige. And, in the end, it wasn't a fatal flaw that did Him in. No, He chose a death on a cross because He knew that sacrifice would save the whole world.

You don't see that in the myths and legends we're seeing so much of in culture right now. Perhaps because it seems so outlandish. A god, with magical powers using them for his own gain and glory, that's easy we'd all expect that. But a God who loves and forgives, and gives His life for others! Who would believe something so preposterous?!

So, this Easter I invite you to once again come and hear the true myth that is Jesus Christ. His story is incredible, it is nearly impossible to believe. But, it's true. That's a story culture, and all of us, should really celebrate.

## Song Story

"Great Is Thy Faithfulness"

The author of the words to this 1923 hymn, Thomas Obediah Chisholm, was born in a log cabin in Kentucky. He came to Christ at age 27 under the ministry of evangelist H. C. Morrison, but his health was unstable. Through all the ups and downs, the third chapter of Lamentations became precious to him: "His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is Your faithfulness" (verses 22-23).

Thomas later admitted there was no dramatic story behind the writing of this hymn. He sent the words to his friend, William Runyan, who composed the music. The hymn gained popularity through its use at Moody Bible Institute in Chicago and in the Billy Graham crusades.

Who's got your back? You know, the one you trust with your closest secrets. The one who'll tell you the truth, even if you don't particularly want to hear it. The one you can call in the middle of the night. Do you have a friend like that? Sure, we've all got neighbors, acquaintances, associates, co-workers, and maybe even pals and cronies. But how many can you count as true friends ...

... the mate who's there for you when the going gets tough?

# Mission Focus: Corner of Love

## Mission Grows Bigger Each Year

For those just getting to know the amazing work that the Corner of Love Mission undertakes each year, it is hard to imagine that this program started as a dream for a simple soup kitchen serving those in Central Nicaragua. Since those early days the missionaries and all their efforts, under the amazing direction of Tanya and Nelson Amador, have touched thousands of lives.

In February and March, two teams headed to San Ramon and surrounding communities for medical



and dental missions. Together the more than 130 volunteers treated more than 11,000 people, dispensed more than 30,000 items from their make shift pharmacy, served 11

villages, hosted a Vacation Bible School for 400 children, hosted the U.S. Ambassador to Nicaragua, and broke ground on a new medical clinic and leadership school. All that in just three short weeks. And more great events and trips are scheduled for the remainder of 2010.

On March 5, Corner of Love received an important visit from U.S. Ambassador Robert Callahan. The ambassador had a chance to tour the dormitory and pharmacy and learn more about all of Corner of Love's programs and operations in Nicaragua. He also took part in the groundbreaking ceremony for the future Medical Clinic and Leadership School. This visit marked an especially important milestone for Corner of Love, as mission leaders, Tanya & Nelson Amador begin to seek International funding and broaden horizons for support through agencies like U.S.Aid.

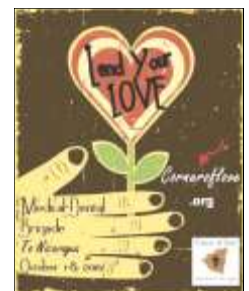

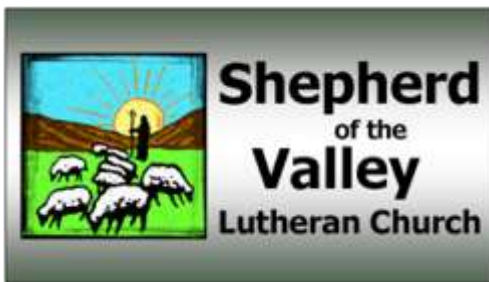
