Pastor's Page

Confirmation

Every year I get to participate in one of my **favorite things as a Pastor, and that's the Confirmation** of several of our young people here at church. I know many in this church grew up in the Lutheran tradition, but we have an increasing number who did not, so Confirmation may not be as clear an idea as we might think. For that matter, what Confirmation is may not look all that similar to the Confirmations many of us grew up with either.

Confirmation is really Affirmation. It's an Affirmation of the Baptism that a young adult received, often when they were just a child. And with that in mind, you start to see the first real shift in Confirmation here. As we emphasize often here at SVLC, Baptism is a recognition that we can do nothing to earn God's love. He simply chooses to love us, and forgive us, because that's who He is.

So, when we baptize a young child, we are seeing that Grace and love and forgiveness in action. Confirmation, then, has traditionally been a time of instruction for young people to learn about this faith in which they were baptized.

Martin Luther's great text, The Small Catechism, has been the template for this in many Lutheran churches and is for ours as well. There, Luther gives insight and challenge into the basic building blocks of faith that any follower of Christ should learn about.

However, in our church and in others, **there's been a subtle shift in the outcome of Confirmation** that I think is a helpful trend. Much of Confirmation used to be about these young adults learning about their traditions, and faith, and even theology, in such a way that they could prove awareness and knowledge of what it meant to be a Lutheran/Christian. This was often culminated in many Lutheran churches with a public **oral quiz, where the "candidates" for Confirmation** had to pass oral exams administered by the Pastor or the Council president before they could be confirmed.

There are a number of things that probably weren't great about this practice, but the biggest one I see it is that we essentially changed the es-

sence of Baptism in Confirmation. Whereas Baptism was about not earning God's Grace, Confirmation seemed to be about proving you were worthy of God's Grace. **A very unfortunate shift, and one that most never really considered, but the practice seems to bear out that type of thinking.**

So, instead what we emphasize here at SVLC is that Confirmation is about taking **ownership of your faith**. **There's still a great deal of learning, and memorization, and conversation, but the end goal isn't for our youth to prove their knowledge and intelligence of Faith. It's for them to be able to stand up and say, after study and prayer this is what I believe! I believe it not because my parents want me to, and not because I have to, but because I choose to. And that is definitely worth celebrating.**

So, I hope we see you at our next Confirmation service, May 2nd during the 10:30 a.m. **worship time. We'll have another amazing group of young people taking amazing steps of faith.** It will be a testimony to the Grace of God and the power of the Holy Spirit in their lives. And their hard work and bold proclamation is to be commended as well.

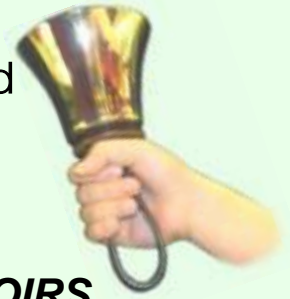

Song Story

"Oh, for a Thousand Tongues to Sing"
by Charles Wesley, 1739

After Charles Wesley's conversion, his life changed, and he gained victory over both his temper and his unfortunate drinking habit. He found a fruitful arena for his ministry at the infamous Newgate Prison, and allowed himself to be locked up with condemned men on nights before their executions, that he might comfort and witness to them during their final hours. As the first anniversary of his conversion approached, Charles wrote an 18-stanza hymn describing his praise. Verse seven began, "O for a thousand tongues to sing...." When his brother John compiled his *Collection of Hymns* in 1787, he chose this for the first hymn in the book, with the seventh verse made the first.

Don't miss out because you think you can't wait. Have you ever thought about what Joshua and the Israelites would've missed if they hadn't followed God's marching orders? (Joshua 3; 6)

If you don't wait, it could hurt others. There are "gasoline girls" and there are "water boys." Which one are you? (Proverbs 15:18)

And for the fifth week, we'll depart from the norm and focus on a "faith skill," that of prayer: Take prayer out of the box. Are you in or out of the box when it comes to prayer? (James 5:13; 1 Thessalonians 5:17; Romans 8:26)

Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church Is Making a Change

Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, is passing the “torch” (or in this case, rubber cow) of Youth Ministry. Drake Oswald, who has been Youth Director for 3 years will now be a full time student and Jacqueline Torfin will taking over.

Jacqueline (Jackie) has been working in Youth Ministry for about ten years. She hails from Fargo, North Dakota and moved to Maple Valley with a family for which she was a nanny in Fargo. Along with her nanny job, she has been working in Youth Ministry at a church in Kirkland. Jackie holds a BS in Elementary Education from Minnesota State University, Moorhead and is currently working on her MA in Children, Youth and Family Ministry from Luther Seminary, St. Paul Minnesota. She is taking classes online and **visits the campus three times per year. She expects to have her Master’s program completed** in May 2011. When asked what she is most looking forward to in her position at SVLC, she stated, **“I just love Youth Ministry. I’m looking forward to getting to know the kids and their families.”**

Drake is taking classes full time at BCC. He expects to go to Seattle University next quarter and plans to study either Spanish or Theology. When asked what he’ll miss most about his work at SVLC, Drake said, **“I’ll miss the people more than anything else. The students will still be on my heart and mind in 50 years when I’ve forgotten every other detail of my time at SVLC.”**

SVLC is placing a renewed emphasis and commitment to Children’s and Youth Ministry. Pastor Bill says, **“We want to build on our reputation of being a place that values kids. Our hope is that Jackie will build a program with kids and volunteers that does just that.”**

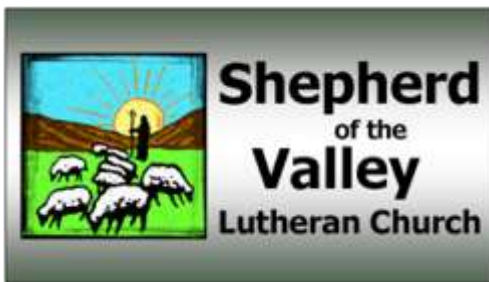
